The National Chairperson of The Council of Canadians, Canada's largest citizen's advocacy organization, Ms Barlow is also the best-selling author (with Tony Clarke) of *Blue Gold: The Fight to Stop Corporate Theft of the World's Water*. She received the prestigious 2005 Right Livelihood Award given by the Swedish Parliament.

Mr James (Jim) Carter

President and Chief Operating Officer of Syncrude Canada Ltd, Mr Carter has contributed to incremental and revolutionary advances in environmental performance. In 2005, he was named Resource Person of the Year by the Alberta Chamber of Resources and was also inducted as a Fellow in the Canadian Academy of Engineering.

Mr Kory Chilibeck

A former University of Alberta political science student, Mr Chilibeck is the founder, president and CEO of Earth Water International, an Edmonton-based bottled water company that directs 100 percent of its net profits to the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees for water aid programs around the world.

Dr David W. Schindler

An Officer of the Order of Canada and the Killam Memorial Chair and Professor of Ecology at the University of Alberta, Dr Schindler has received numerous national and international research awards. These include the first Stockholm Water Prize in 1991, the NSERC Gerhard Herzberg Gold Medal for Science and Engineering in 2001 and the Tyler Prize for Environmental Achievement in 2005.
